DOMESTIC WORKERS STAND IN SOLIDAR-ITY AND ELECT NEW LEADERSHIP

The International Domestic Workers Federation (IDWF) is pleased to announce the election of its new leadership following the successful conclusion of its 4th Congress. This historic event, held in De Haan, Belgium from October 2nd to October 5th, showcased the organization's commitment to solidarity, democracy, representation, and the advancement of domestic workers' rights on a global scale.

The IDWF congress was a remarkable exercise in democratic participation, where official delegates from 88 domestic worker unions and organizations from 68 countries representing over 670,000 domestic workers from around the world gathered to discuss, deliberate, and make decision on the future direction of the Federation. Over 150 delegates engaged in important discussions around resolutions, constitutional amendments, objectives challenges, and demands to fully achieved domestic workers' rights.
